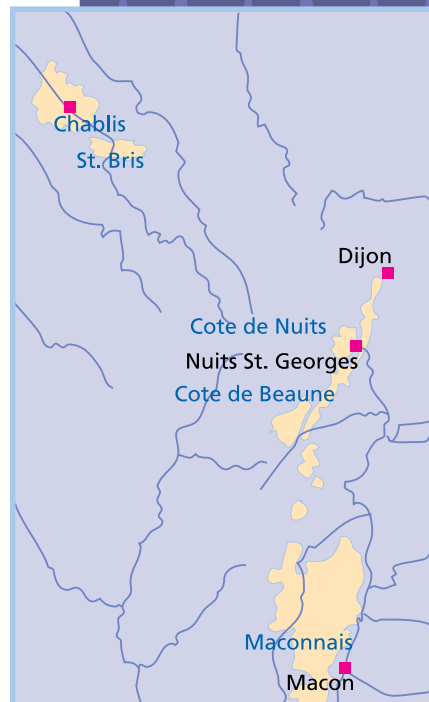


BURGUNDY

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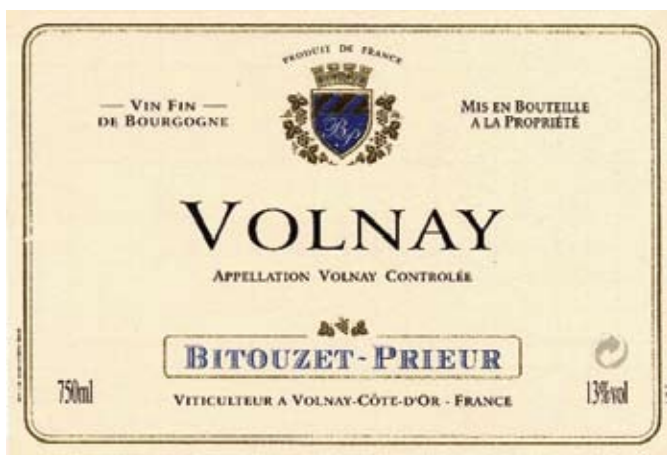
The most valuable agricultural land in the world lies in Burgundy. The vineyard of Le Montrachet with its few rows of Chardonnay vines and just up the road, the Pinot Noir of the Domaine de la Romanée Conti.



PINOT NOIR

Is still the most difficult grape from which to make great red wine, but success leads to magical results. The small villages and even smaller vineyards of Gevrey Chambertin, Nuits St. Georges, Volnay, Beaune and others produce wines with huge flavours. No wonder the French Army salutes when marching past.



Why doesn't French law allow the name of the grape on Burgundy labels especially Chablis, Meursault, Puligny Montrachet, Pouilly Fuissé, Macon Villages - some of the world's most highly rated white wines and all made with Chardonnay? Top white Burgundies are a mouthwatering balance of lemon fruit, complex flavours and balancing acidity with a finish which lingers in the memory.

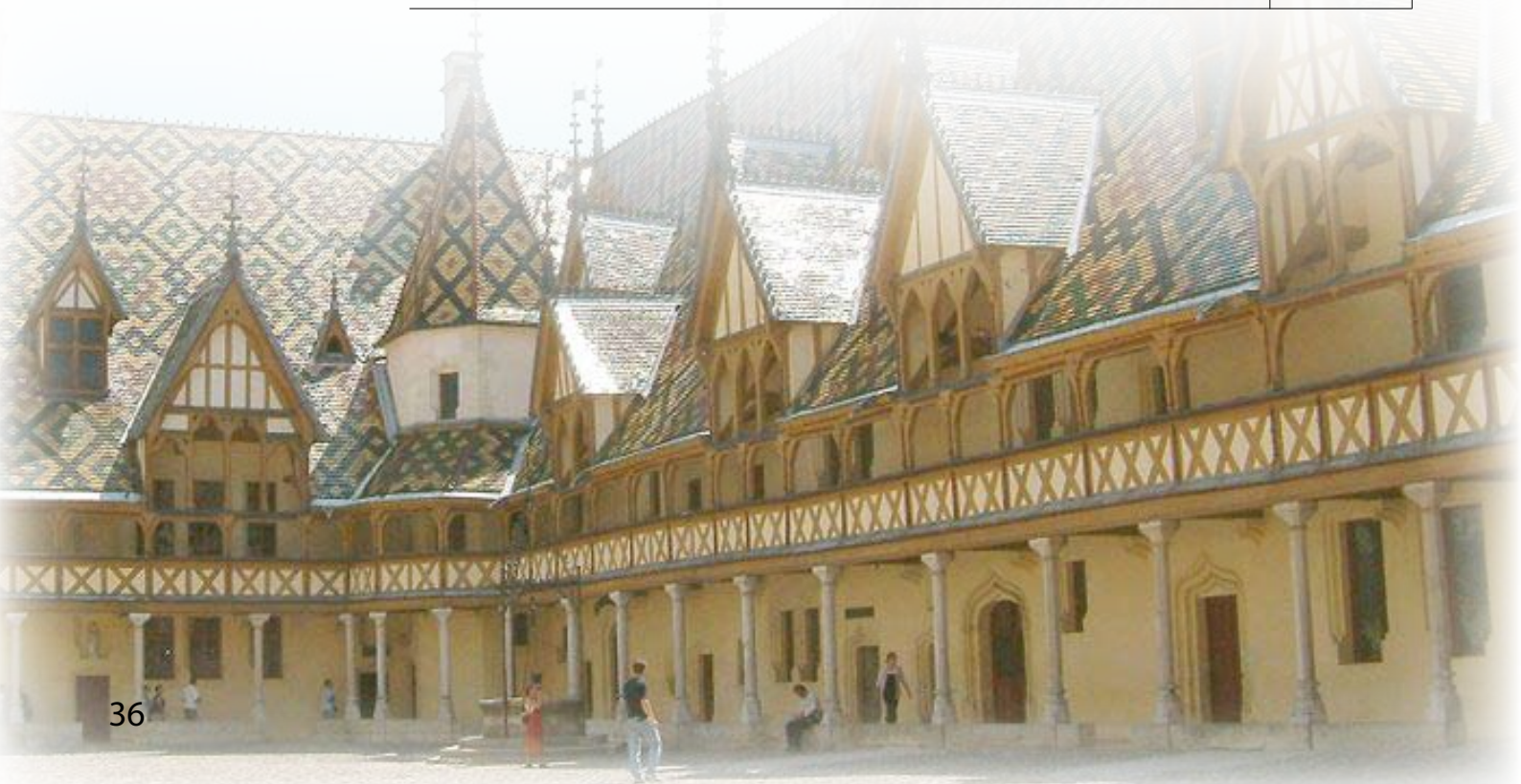

<p>££ Beaune 2006, Lois Dufouleur A very attractive year produced some gems particularly from vigneron prepared to sacrifice quantity for quality. It is virtually impossible to obtain Burgundy combining such fruit and fragrance and velvet tannins at this price.</p>	B	£15.95
<p>Marsannay, 2004, Domaine Dupont Tisserandot A bouquet of redcurrants and cherries and a clean, refreshing palate make this an attractive but very proper Pinot Noir.</p>	B	£19.90

Chablis

Petit Chablis, Domaine Christian Simon

Chablis is so popular with all ranges of customer that we have had to look for a slightly lighter but still steely alternative to the wines listed below.

Chablis, J. Moreau et Fils

Flint and mineral flavours combine with the lemon fruit of the Chardonnay giving a long finish.

Chablis, Domaine Christian Simon

Chablis from a top quality winemaker which shows the unique qualities of freshness, finesse and depth of flavour.

Chablis Premier Cru Montmains, Domaine Christian Simon

Premier Cru Chablis possesses all the qualities for which Chablis is famous together with a fullness of body and flavour.

Macon Blanc Villages, Henry Fessy

Round, full and generous in flavour.

Bourgogne Chardonnay, Cave d'Aze

A proper Bourgogne Chardonnay like this reflects the lemony fruit, elegance and complexity of its more famous neighbours.

Sauvignon St. Bris

The only non Chardonnay allowed in Burgundy is Sauvignon Blanc from this small area. The wine has the pungent fruit of the grape allied to the ripe round flavour of the region.

Saint-Veran 'Vielle Vignes' Personnets

A wine not as well known as it deserves as it provides a delicate, mineral bouquet, a refreshing citric but non-acidic taste and a clean, full finish. A quite outstanding example of fine wine-making.

Pouilly Fuissé, Henry Fessy

The best white from the Macon region. Made with a cocktail of generous fruit and delicate oak, giving weight, length and complexity.

Meursault, Les Grand Charrons, Domaine du Chateau de Citaux

The combination of classic Chardonnay lemon flavours with hazelnut, vanilla and unsalted butter overtones creates a most attractive wine with great depth of flavour.

Puligny Montrachet Les Levrans, Domaine Bitouzet-Prieur

Chardonnay from Puligny-Montrachet has the reputation of being the most intense expression of wine made from this grape in the world. The superbly drained soil forces the vines deep to produce intensity of flavour and concentration. There should also be a richness and variety of aromas and tastes from the more well-known lemon, butter and vanilla to the more subtle hazelnut and brioche.
