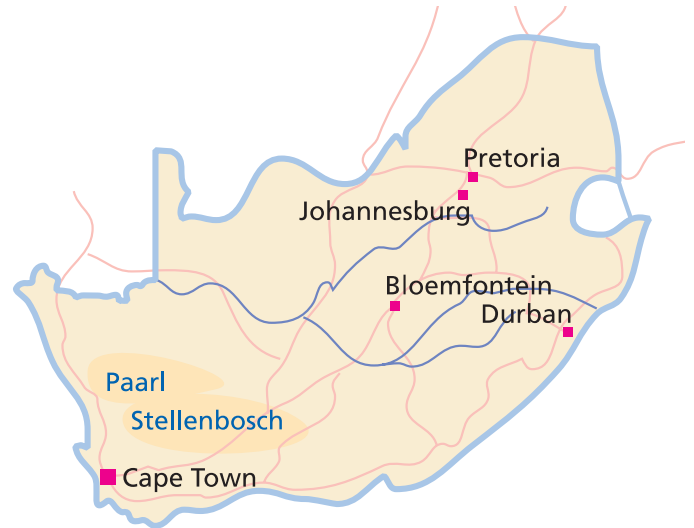

A high quality family owned property situated on the slopes of the Simonsberg mountains overlooking the town of Paarl. The Joubert family are by calling horticulturists and grape growers. They say that the best fertilizer for the vineyard is the growers’ footsteps. They are very hands on with every stage of the winemaking process carefully managed to produce the best fruit possible which results in high quality wine production.

From being grape growers it was not until 1994 that the “Joubert” label arrived on world markets as winemakers in their own right as economic restrictions on South Africa were lifted.
